Hopefully my background underscores my deep commitment to advancing cybersecurity and consumer privacy protections in the United States.

The incorporation of transparent and simple privacy information on the Monroney sticker not only aligns with the principles I advocate for but also holds the potential to significantly enhance consumer awareness and control over their data in the United States. This will empower consumers, increase trust, and ensure that they are well-informed about what happens to their data, enabling them to make informed purchasing decisions.

I reiterate my strong support for the inclusion of the IoTAB's Monroney recommendation in the Final IoTAB report. This recommendation promises to be a significant step forward for consumers' data use transparency standards in the automotive sector, and I believe it is a crucial initiative that should not be overlooked.
