



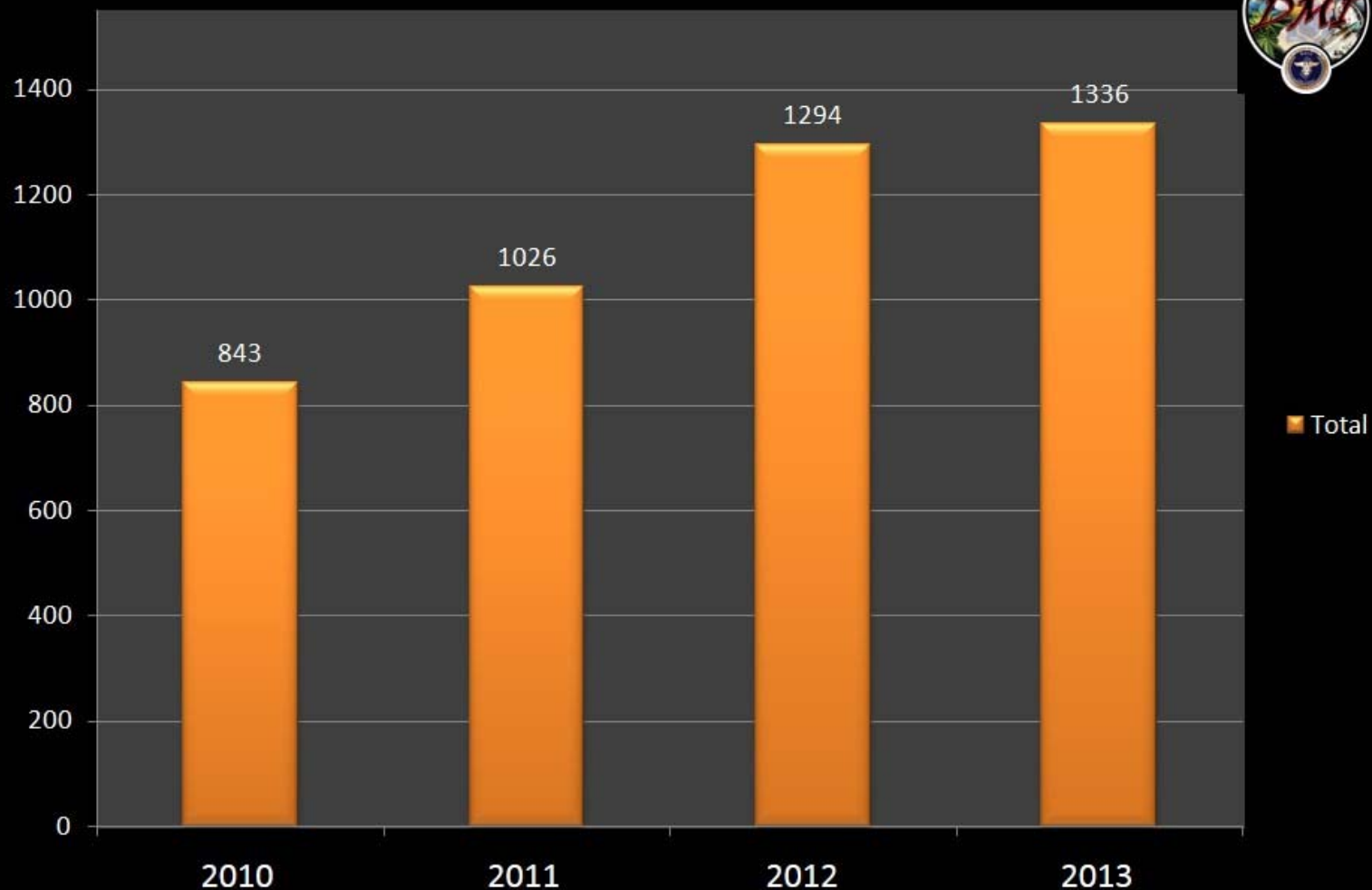

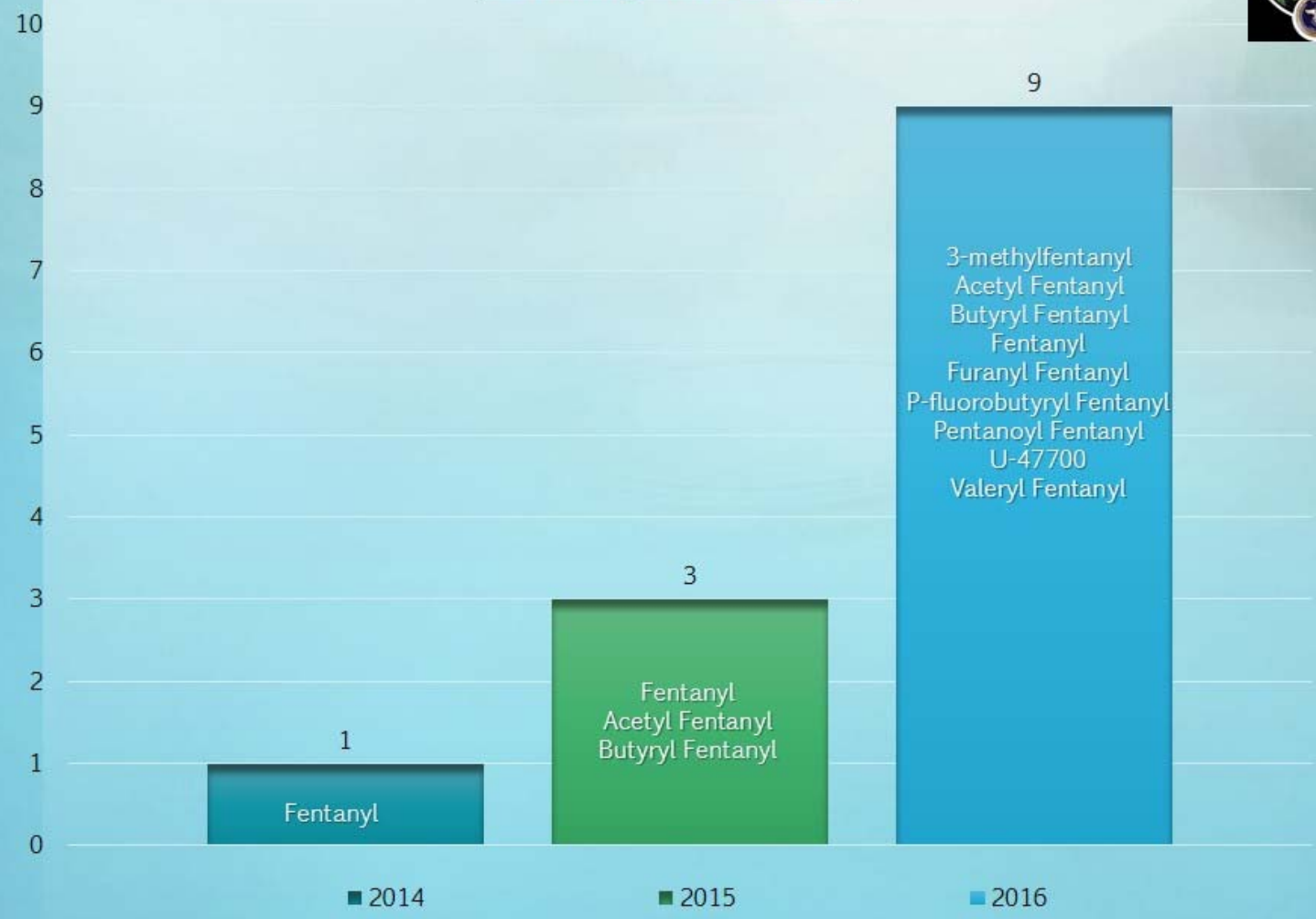

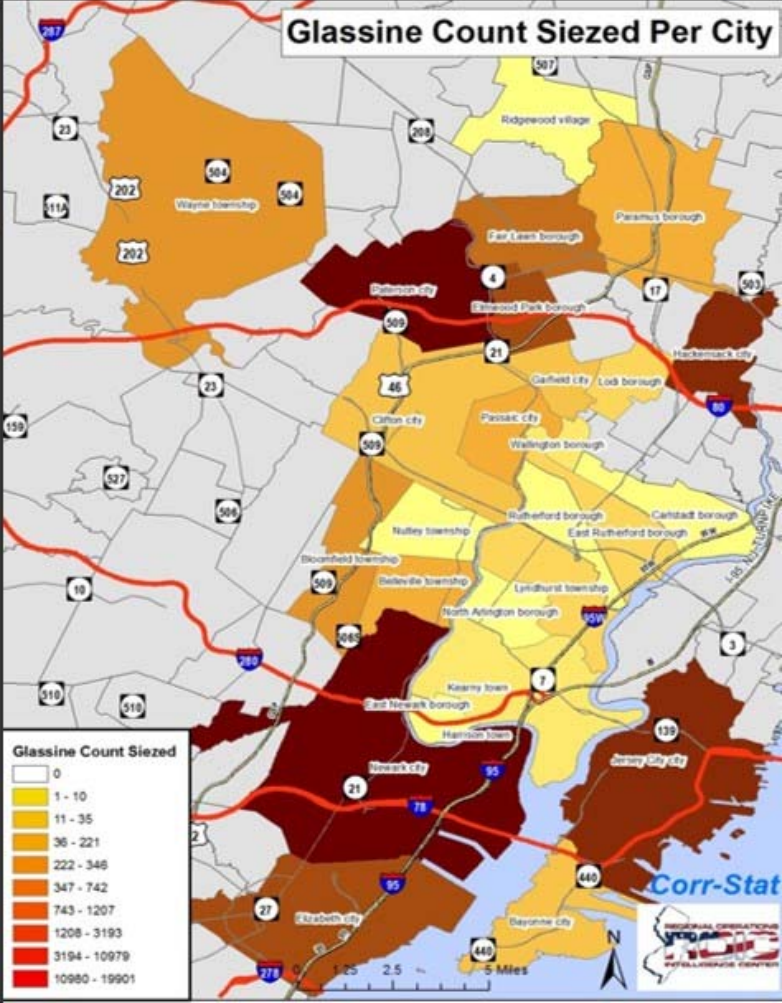

(U//LES) The New Jersey Regional Operations Intelligence Center (ROIC) monitors drug activity through the Drug Monitoring Initiative (DMI). The following heroin stamp information is gathered from forensic crime labs throughout the state. It should be noted that stamp names by themselves do not constitute reliable connections between incidents such as overdoses and arrests. However, stamp names in combination with other variables such as stamp colors and adulterants provide potential investigative leads. Moreover, stamps having these similarities, and located within regional proximity and time, provide stronger indicators of potential connectivity. Any law enforcement agency encountering the listed stamps or requiring further information, should contact the department associated with the incident.

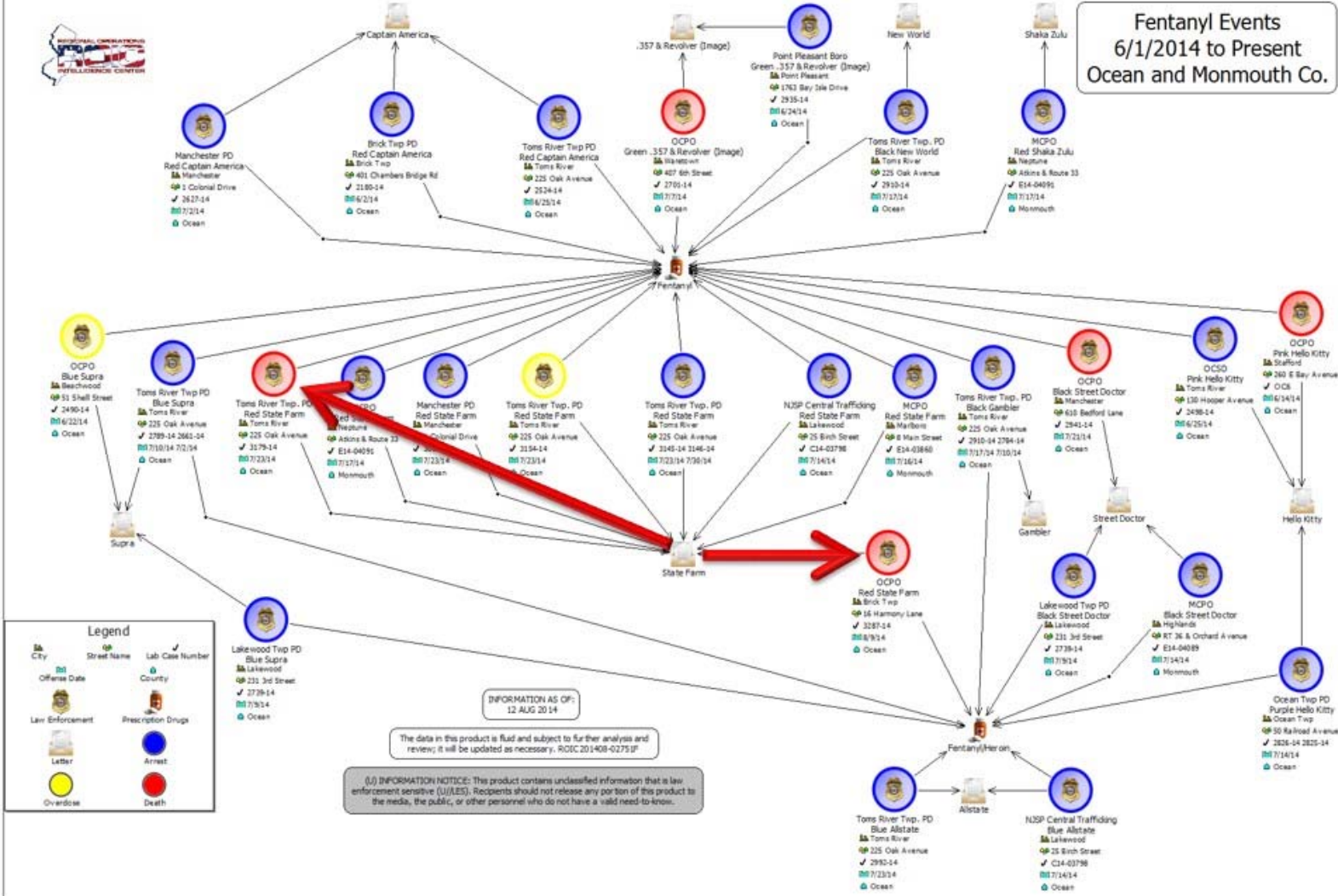

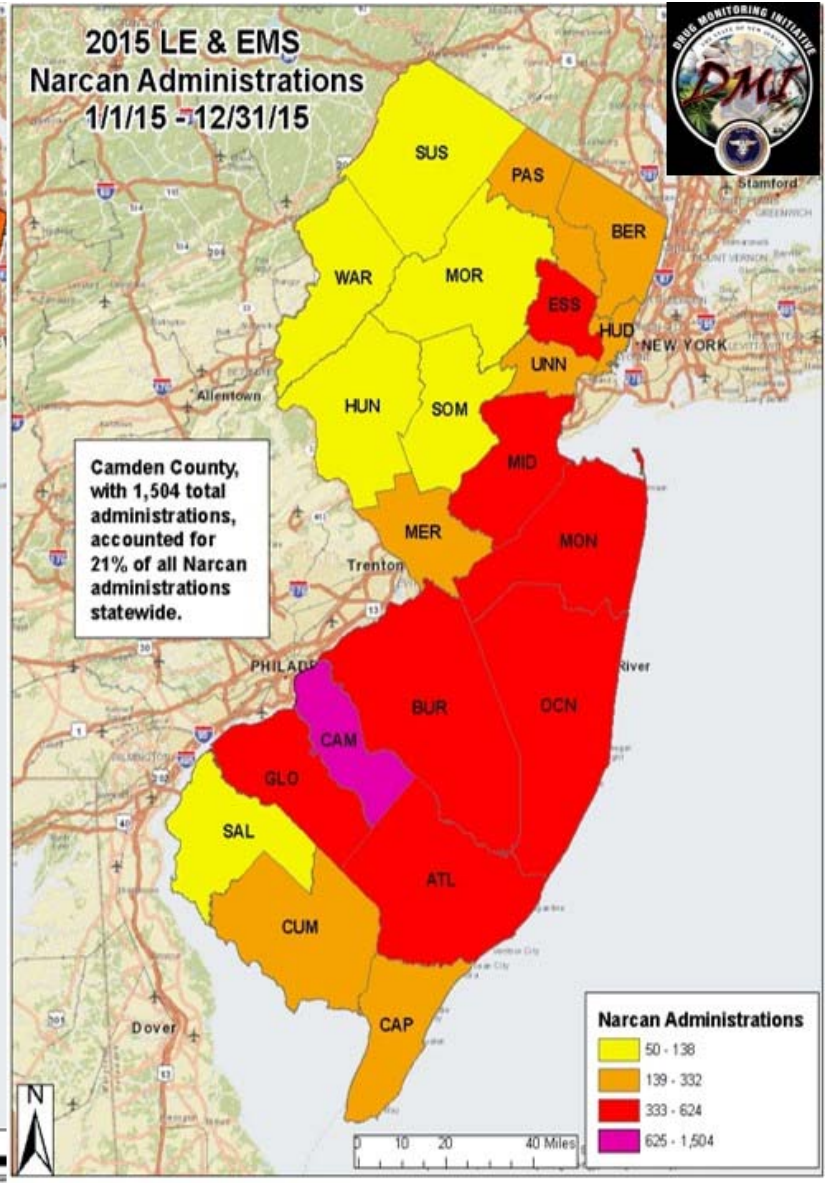
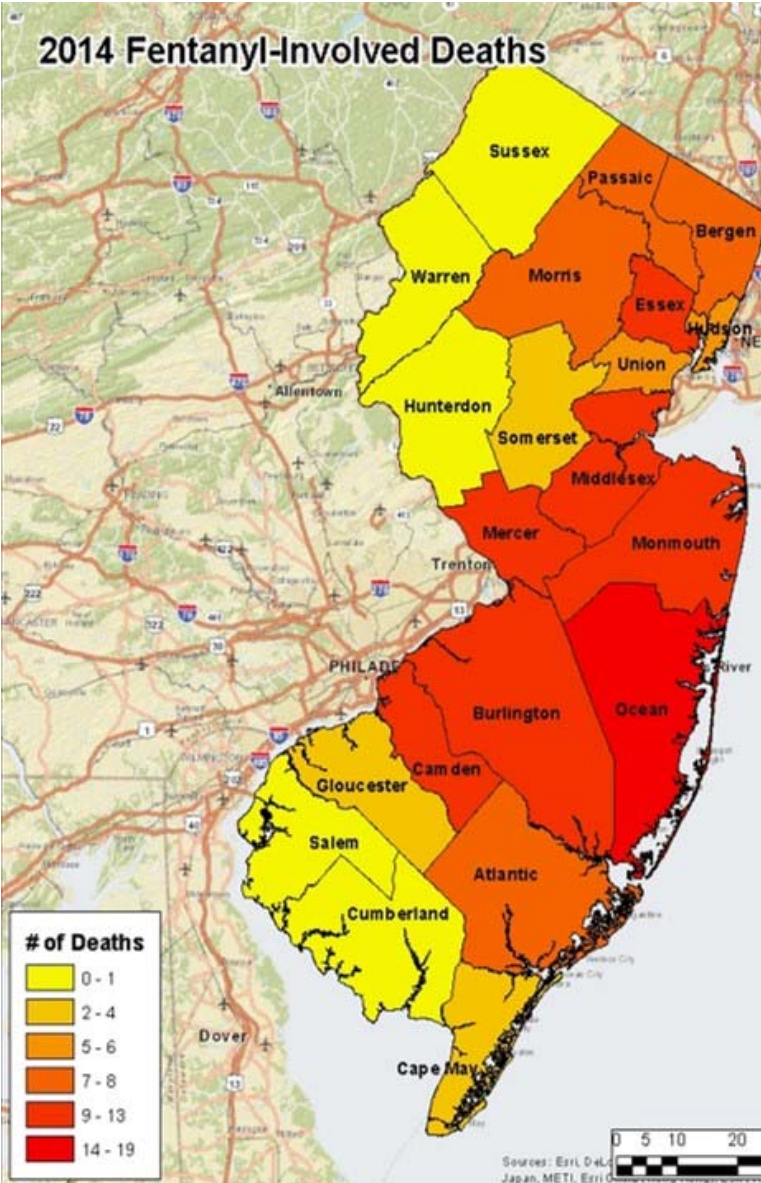
Drug Arrests by Age



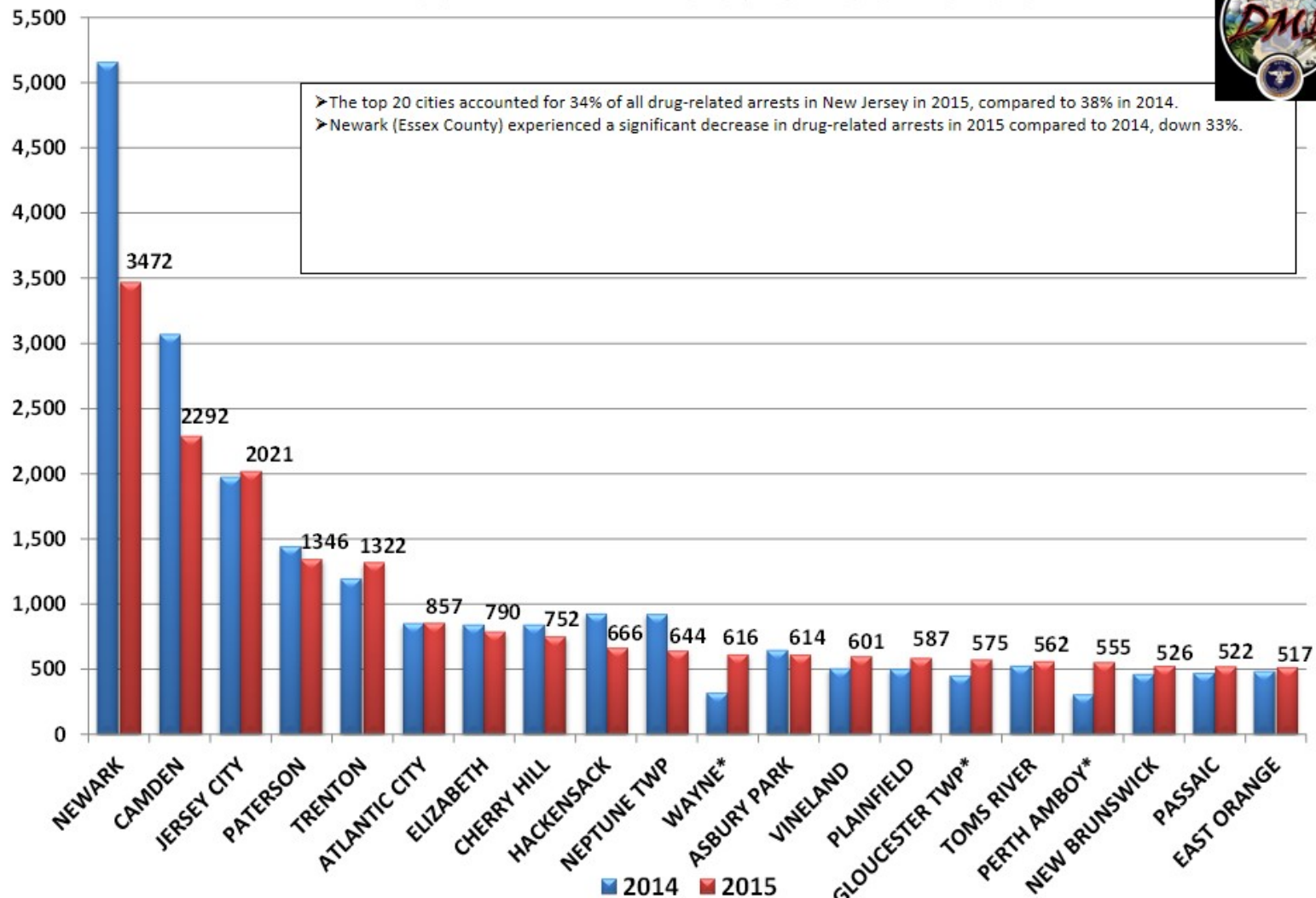

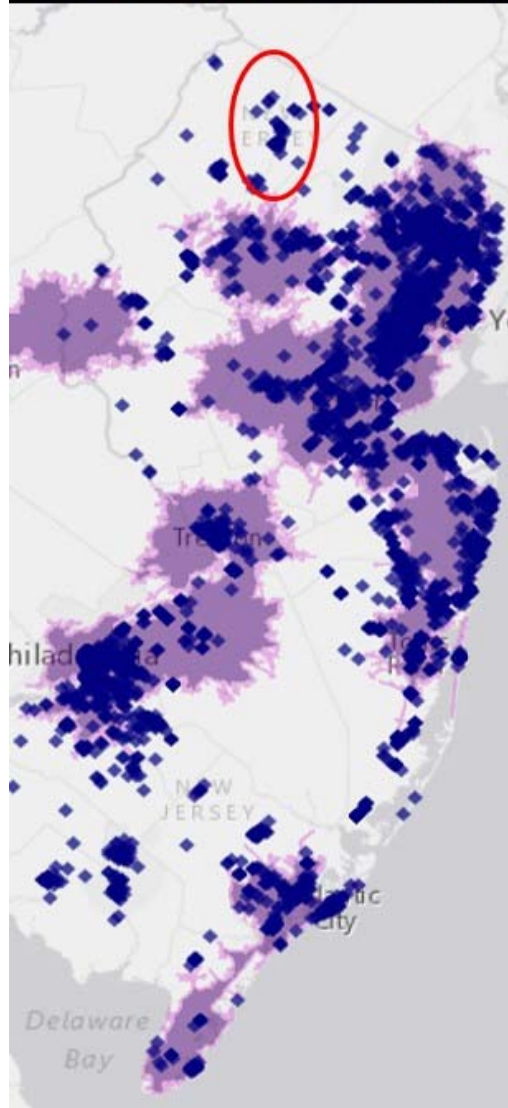

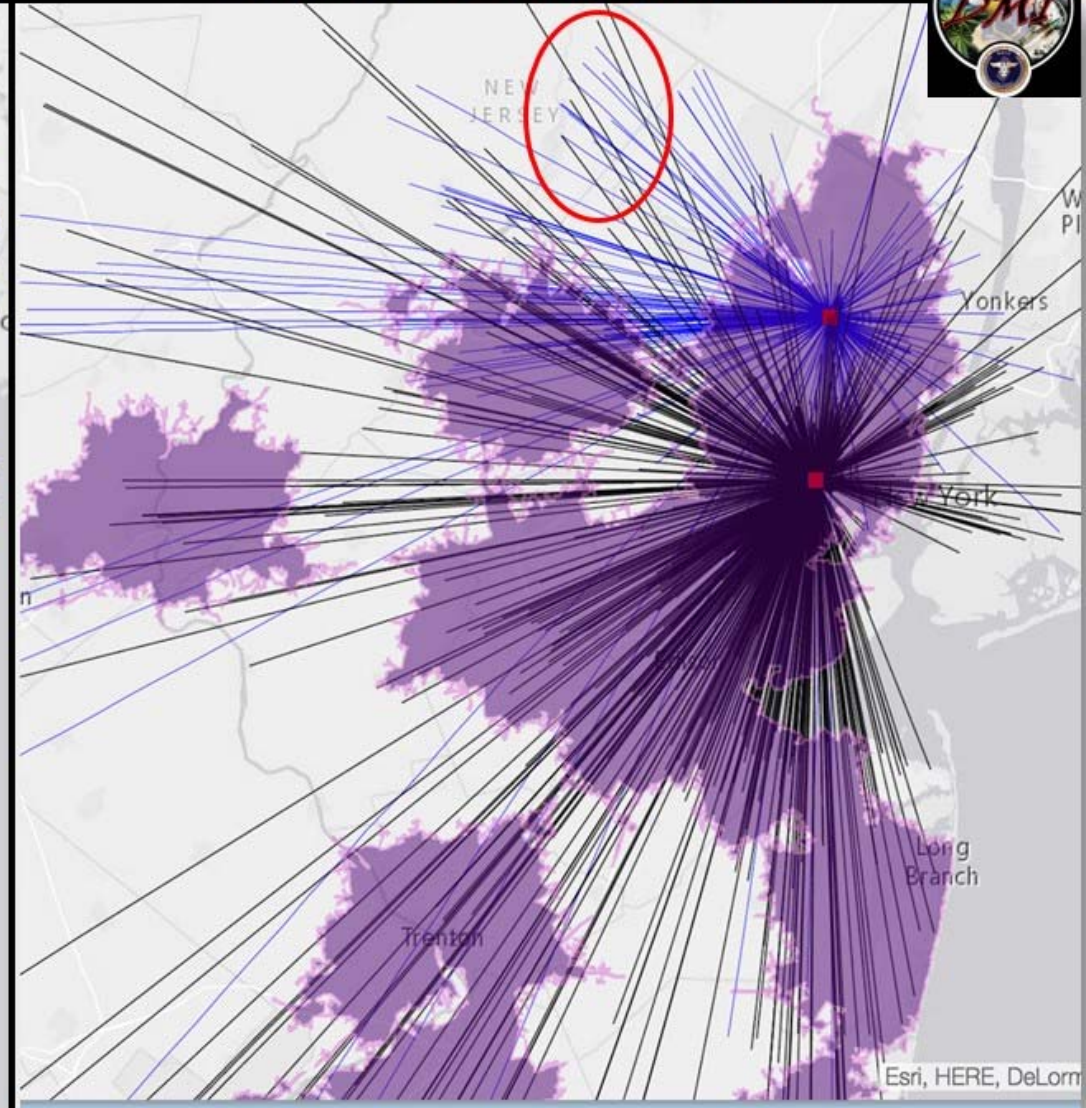

DRUG MONITORING INITIATIVE BEST PRACTICES

- Facilitates collaboration among diverse multidisciplinary entities to address the drug problem
- Uses automated drug data collection processes to ensure a timely exchange of information
- Desensitizes information to ensure seamless and transparent information sharing
- Derives intelligence from all investigative and administrative drug data
- Incorporates subject matter experts from various disciplines into the drug intelligence production process
- Supports narcotic investigations and overdose strict liability cases
- Facilitates expedited analysis of drugs seized through forensic labs
- Employs the Journey-to-Drugs methodology to understand a drug's impact on local areas
- Coordinates collection, analysis, and mapping of drug-incident data statewide
- Uses empirical data as opposed to survey data to understand the drug environment
- Provides drug training for law enforcement, fire service, and EMS personnel
- Provides drug situational awareness for all constituents

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Key Findings

Drug Arrests

- Drug-related arrests in the county have increased significantly in the first half of 2016.
- Of 4,317 drug-related arrests, 32% were individuals from outside the county.
- 71% of drug-related arrests in the county were of individuals 18 to 29 years of age.
 - Statewide, 61% of drug-related arrests were of individuals in that age range.
- 57% of drug distribution arrests occurred in 10 of the 39 municipalities in the county.

Heroin Seizures

- Heroin seizures in the county are concentrated along Interstate 80.
- When compared to the entire state, Morris County represents only 3% of cases of suspected heroin submitted to forensic labs.
- 11% of suspected heroin submissions to the State Police OFS labs were found to contain fentanyl class chemicals.

Naloxone

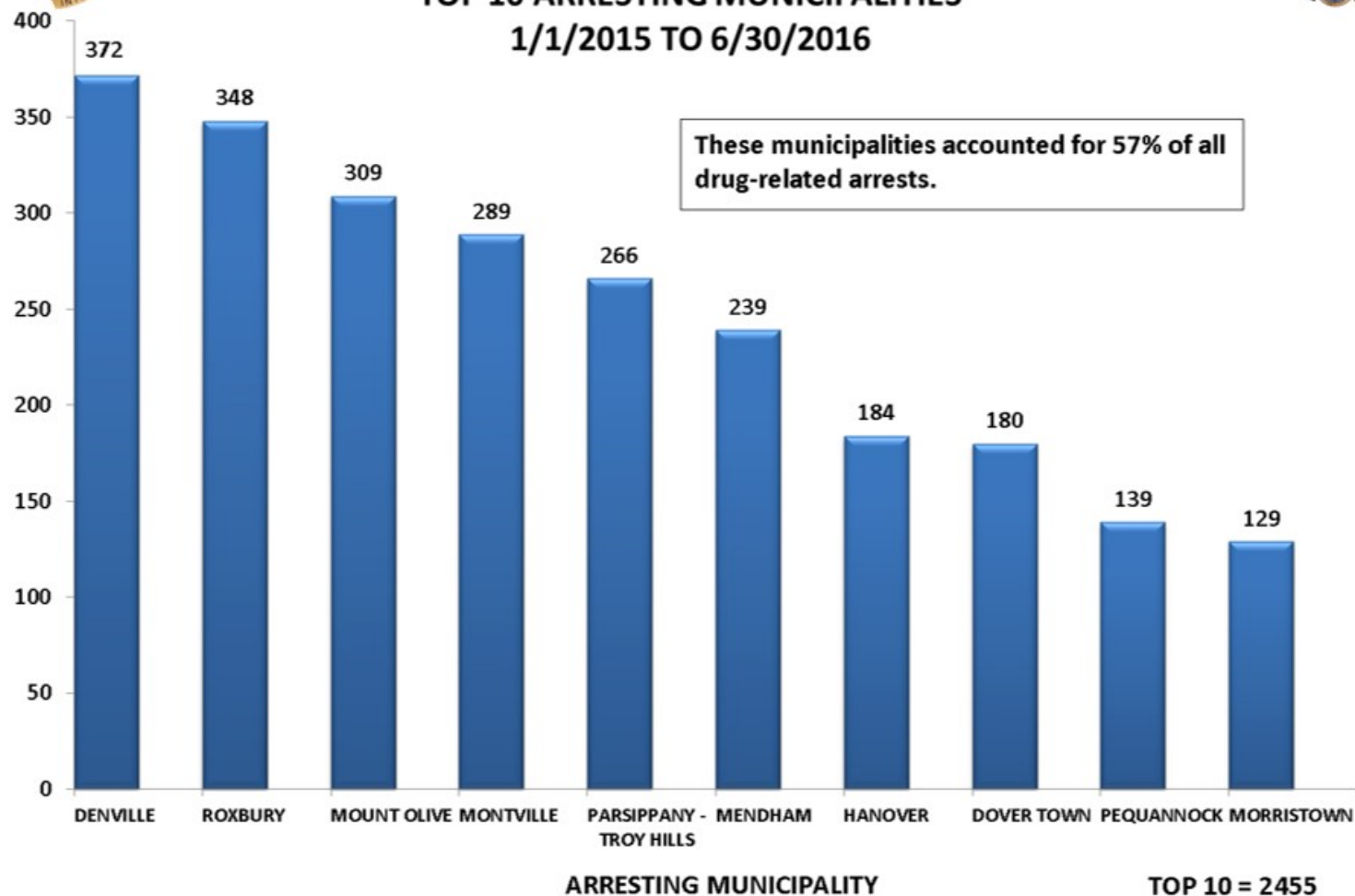
- 74% of naloxone administrations were given to Morris County residents; 22% were given to out of county residents; in 4% of administrations, the residence was unknown.
- The majority of naloxone administrations being given to in-county residents is consistent with statewide trends.



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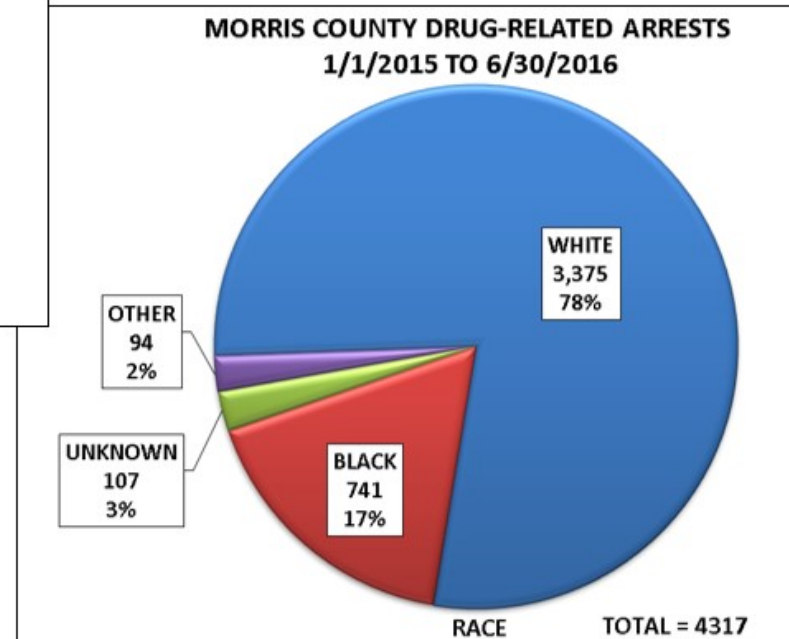
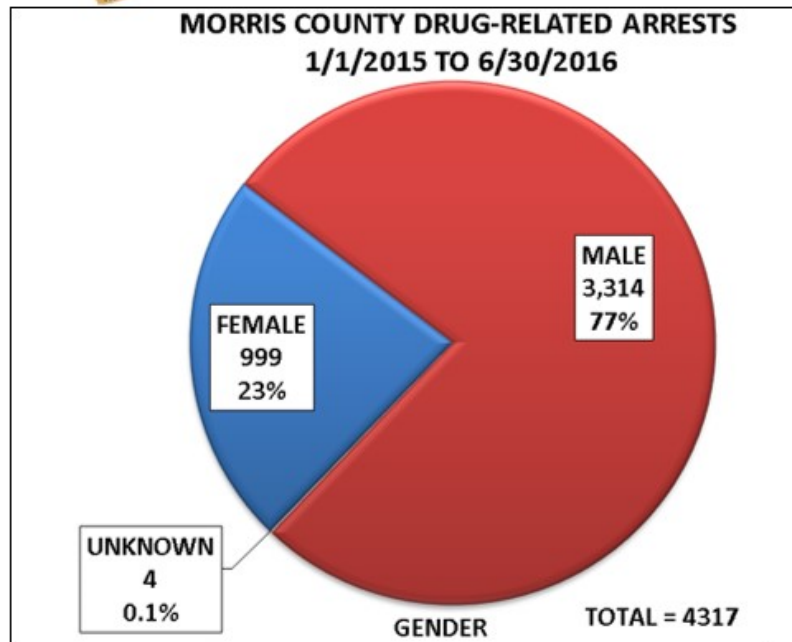

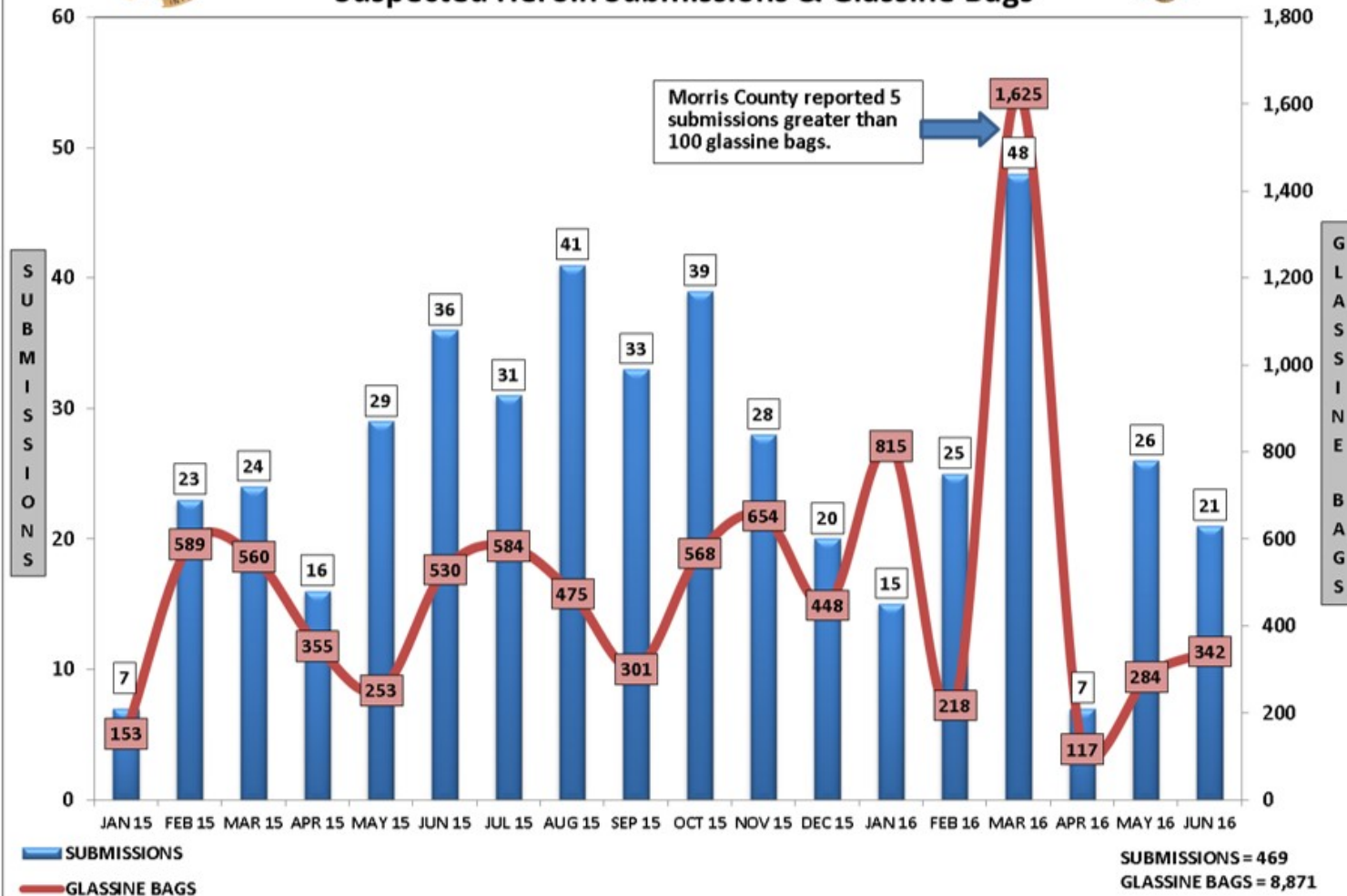

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Morris County January 2015 to June 30, 2016 Suspected Heroin Submissions & Glassine Bags

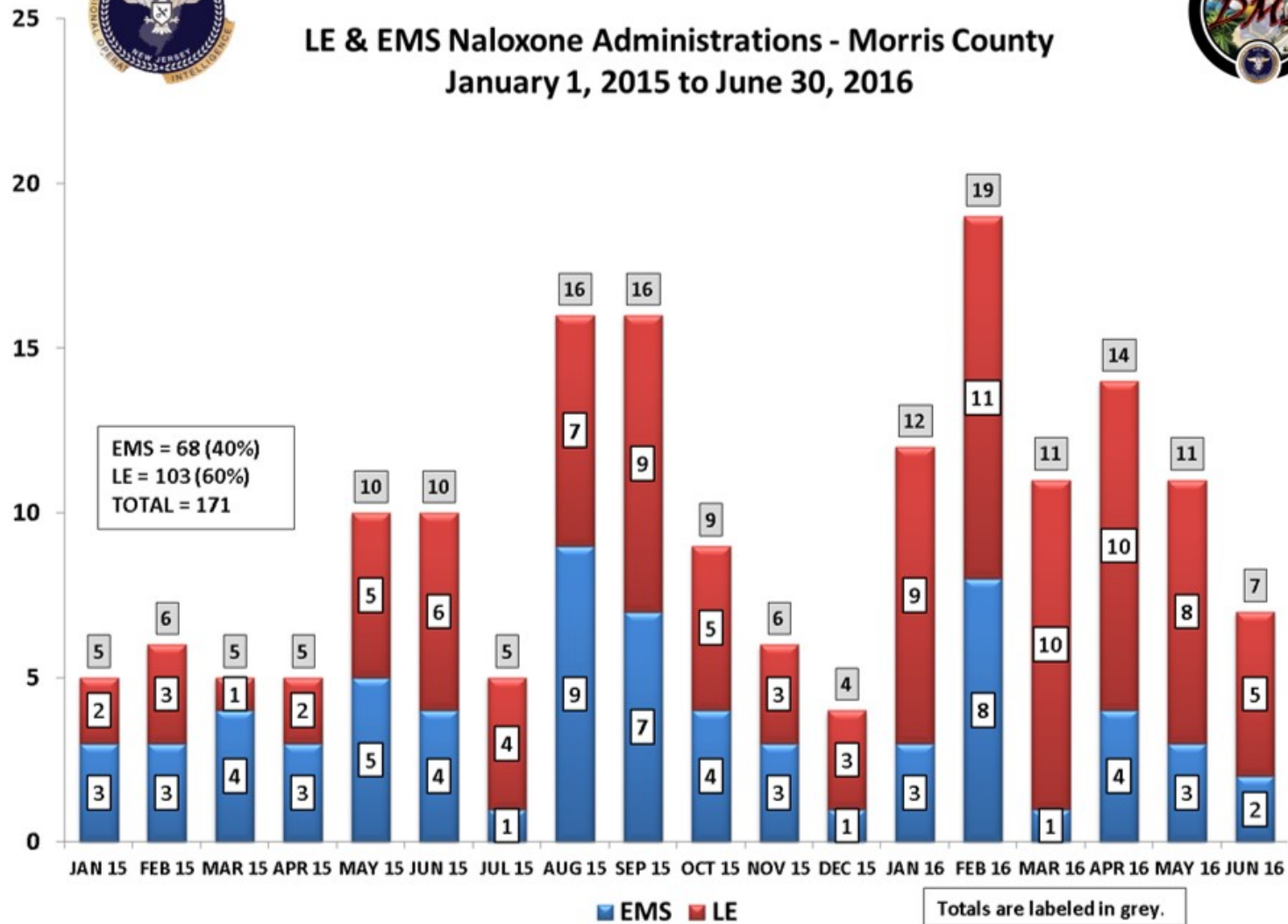

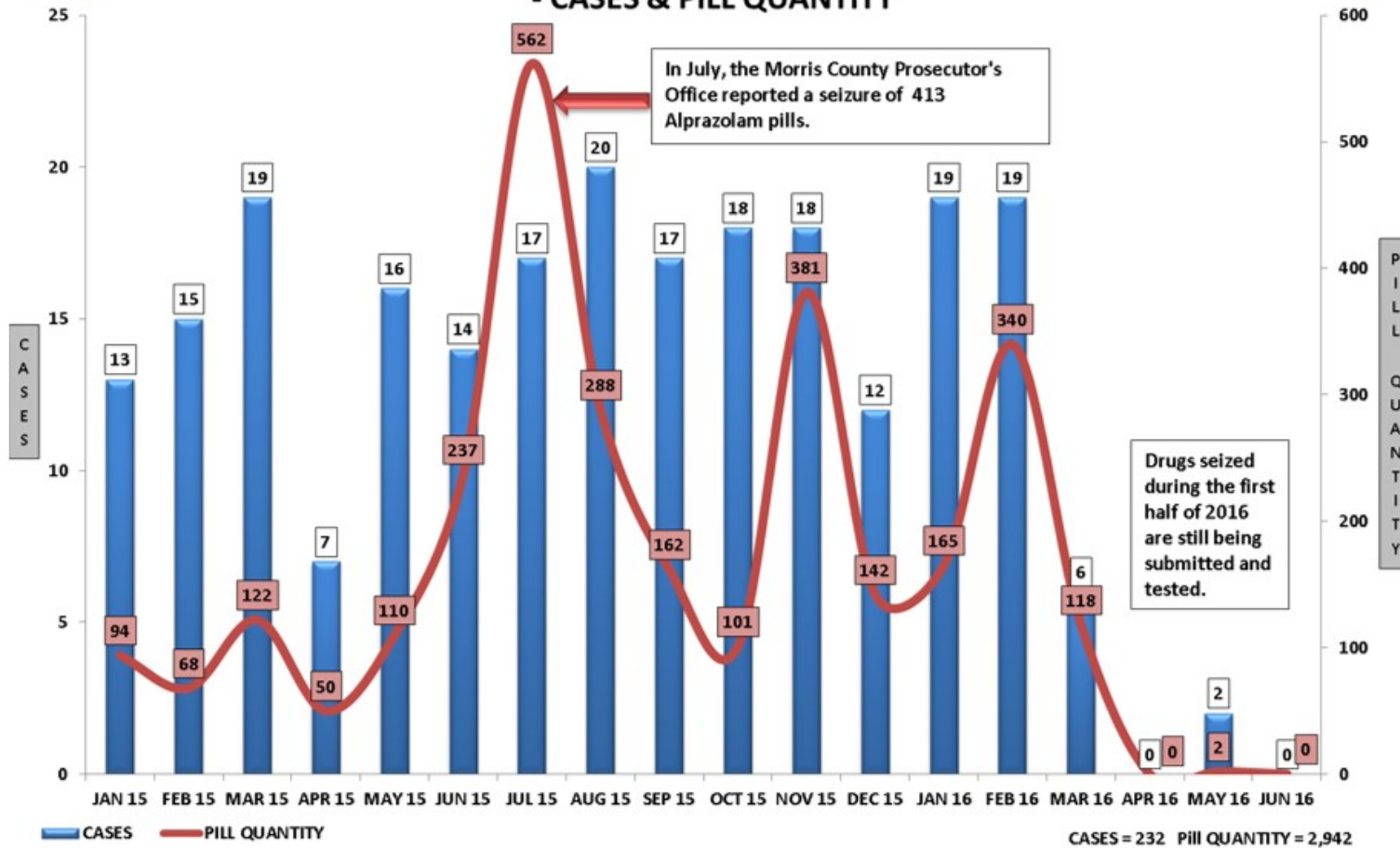
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MORRIS COUNTY PRESCRIPTION LEGEND DRUGS (PLDS) - CASES & PILL QUANTITY

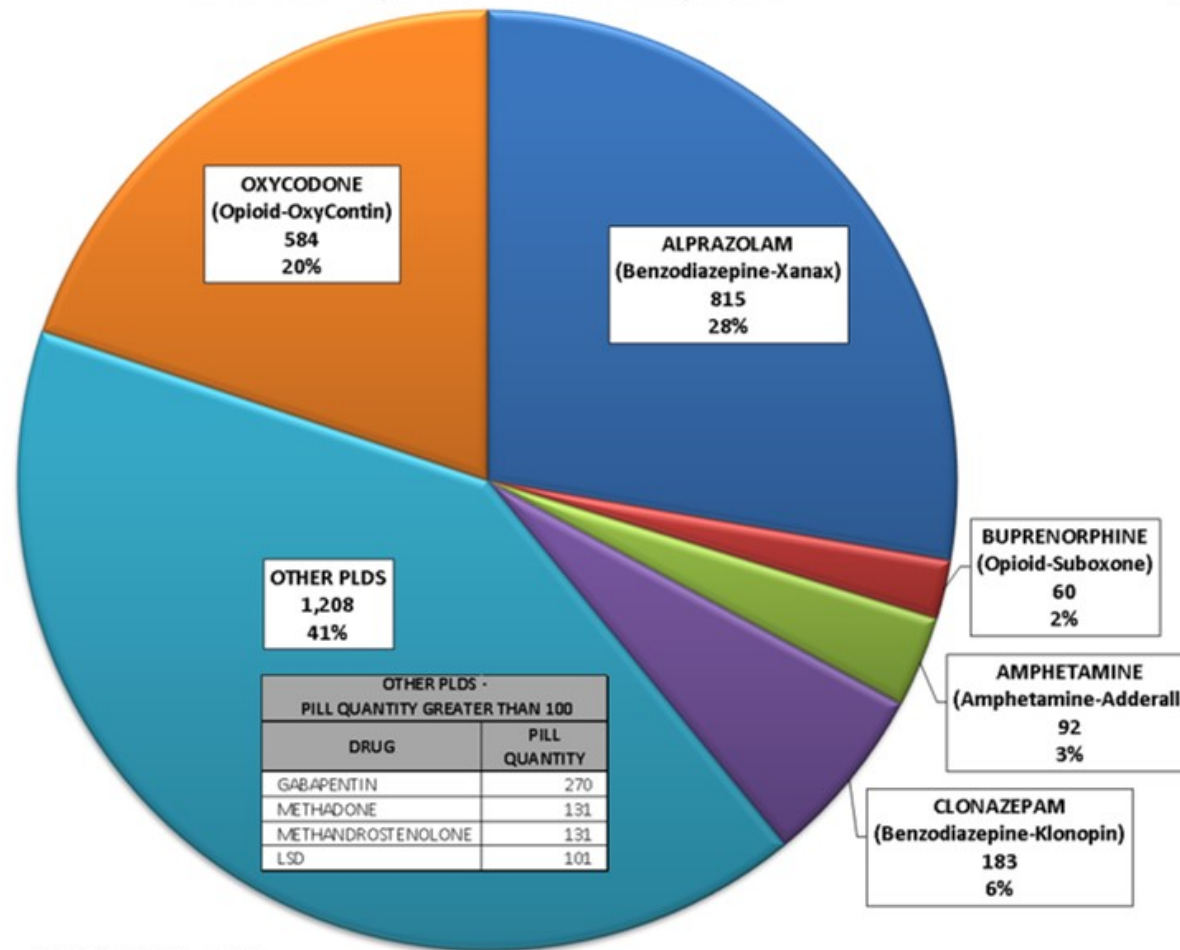

Annual & Monthly Trends:
 The number of heroin related emergency department (ED) visits during the first eight months of 2015 is 74% greater than the number of heroin ED visits during the same eight months in 2014. There were 15.8% more heroin ED visits in August than in July. This is 15% lower than the 60% difference between May and June. If the annual trend from the prior two years continues, there will likely be a spike in heroin related emergency department visits in early fall.
