Superior Educator Accomplishment

As an educator, Donna Woods's passion is found in serving underrepresented and at-risk student populations as a Cyber/STEM Interdisciplinary Educator providing equitable access across ethnic, cultural, academic, and socio-economic spheres. Her first priority is to ensure her students have an in-depth understanding of the knowledge, skills, and abilities within the NICE Cybersecurity Workforce Framework and NICCS career readiness, technical, and industry standards towards developing a future ethical workforce of cybersecurity experts. The three-year guided pathway and dual-enrollment courses guarantee students obtain college credits and industry certifications validating their subject mastery and college and career readiness.

Donna Woods serves as a devoted advocate on behalf of students, families, and educators throughout the state in writing and receiving grants valued at \$4.1 million. The funding cultivates viable academic investment, curricula development, collaboration, and economic workforce partnerships between K-20, regional and state consortia, government, and industry while providing invaluable opportunities for *all* students. Culminating in the construction of the nation's first 7,000 square foot Cyber Innovation Center on a high school campus designed to serve students, community, and businesses throughout the region, state, and nation.

Donna authored the UC a-g Cyber Guided Pathway curriculum for Riverside County Office of Education consisting of three yearlong courses of tiered-level development and two Dual-Enrollment ICT courses for college credit, infusing cybersecurity throughout the educational portfolio. Courses are focused and aligned to CTE, NICE Framework, and Industry Standards. The curriculum has been adopted by numerous school districts throughout the state as a model curriculum, due to the rigor, industry validation, and innovative key projects integrated into each course including community outreach/service, student led conference presentations, case studies research, evaluation, and solutions, cyber competitions, and internships and apprenticeships. Notably, throughout the five years of the cyber program, all students-representing diverse academic levels-have achieved 100% graduation rates, 100% college and career readiness attainment, and 97.4% industry certifications.

In collaboration with the Inland Empire/Desert Regional Consortium, industry partners, city officials, and legislative leaders, Donna has guided the development of a four-year, work-based learning and training program wherein students begin with job shadowing, progress to internships during their junior year, and obtain paid internships during their senior year, continuing as paid apprenticeships during college.

Through these partnerships, Donna successfully developed/coaches nationally recognized, state award winning cyber competition teams for middle schools and high schools at MVUSD. Extending beyond her district, she hosts CyberPatriot Summer Camps and authored the Coaches Training Manual to teach/mentor instructors from California and our nation on developing cyber academic pathways, after-school clubs, and competitive teams.

Donna testified before the Joint Cybersecurity Session in Sacramento and serves as a conference presenter throughout the nation at NICE K12, 3CS, CTE Educating for Careers,



WASTC Cisco, and SoCal Cybersecurity Summit. Community outreach and service with her students includes: GEMS, Girls that Code, Girls Go Cyber Start, NSA National Day of Cyber, United Way, Girls Scout Cybersecurity Day, Senior Cyber Awareness, and Small Business Cyber Readiness.

Certifications: Microsoft Expert Certified, IT Fundamentals+, and Cybrary Certifications in Cryptography, Networks, Data Forensics.

Academic Achievement of Students

Donna's students' greatest achievement within the Cyber Academic Pathway is in breaking the barriers that sought to define them such as poverty, foster-youth, homelessness, and determining to be the first in their family to attend college. Throughout their five-year journey, it is the students who seized the opportunity provided them, determined and planned their outcome, and chartered their destiny and future in cybersecurity.

Comprising the full range of academic ability from Special Needs, English Language Learner, and Honors to AP, the students continually master the art of collaborative team building in learning how to draw from each other's strengths, critically strategize to surpass their weaknesses, and celebrate shared victories in all areas.

Competitively the CyberPatriot Teams have earned 9-Platinum Tier Semi-Finalist, 3 – 1_{st} in State, Gold Tier, 2-2_{nd} in State, Gold Tier, 12-Gold Tier Semi-Finalist, and 2-1_{st} in State, Silver Tier and three middle school national semi-finalist teams.
