

Guidance for Making Extramural Data Available Through NIST's Data Management Infrastructure

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PURPOSE

This document establishes guidance for preserving and sharing extramural data through NIST's data publication infrastructure.

APPLICABILITY

This guidance is provided for Federal Program Officers and other NIST staff who are responsible for grants, contracts, and other agreements and arrangements that generate scientific research data.

GUIDANCE

According to the Specific Award Conditions of NIST funding agreements, data preservation and sharing is the awardee's responsibility. In other agreements or arrangements, that responsibility may not be specified. In some cases, NIST may choose to make extramural data available through NIST's data management infrastructure (i.e., MIDAS, the associated data repository, and the NIST Science Data Portal). These resources may be used for storage of extramural data and metadata that meet the following criteria:

- 1. The awardee or extramural contributor is an individual researcher or research group.
- 2. The funding agreement or other agreement gives NIST the right to disseminate the data.
- 3. The data has a high potential for re-use, and its continued availability is in NIST's

interest.

4. The Federal Program Officer (FPO) or other NIST point of contact (POC) and their Division Chief agree that the data is of sufficient quality for NIST to make it public.

A NIST point of contact must be provided for the entry in MIDAS, and a NIST disclaimer¹ must be included. Extramural data must be reviewed and approved through the FPO or POC's division in the same way intramural data is reviewed and approved.

NIST staff located at Joint Institutes and in Centers of Excellence must follow NIST directives for data preservation and distribution. Data produced by non-NIST staff at Joint Institutes and in Centers of Excellence other than federally funded research and development centers (FFRDCs) is expected to be preserved and distributed by those organizations in accordance with their Data Management Plans. NIST may choose to make copies of some or all data from Joint Institutes and Centers of Excellence, other than FFRDCs, available if it meets criteria 2 through 4 above and resources are available as determined by the Associate Director for Laboratory Programs.
