



INSTRUCTIONS

The voter shall, immediately upon receiving the ballot, go to a voting booth and vote the ballot in the following manner:

STRAIGHT TICKET (Paper ballot): If the voter desires to vote a straight party ticket, the voter may place a cross (X) mark in the left of the names of candidates on one party ticket. (Section 115.439.1(1), RSMo, 1994)

STRAIGHT TICKET (Punch card): If the voter desires to vote a straight party ticket, the voter may punch a hole opposite the name of the candidates on one party ticket.

STRAIGHT TICKET (Optical scan): If the voter desires to vote a straight party ticket, the voter may darken the oval next to the name of the candidates on one party ticket.

SPLIT TICKET (Paper ballot): If the voter desires to vote a split party ticket, the voter may place a cross (X) mark in the circle directly to the left of the name of the candidates on other party tickets, or the voter may place cross (X) marks in the squares directly to the left of the names of candidates on other party tickets.

SPLIT TICKET (Punch card): If the voter desires to vote a split party ticket, the voter may punch the hole opposite the name of the candidates on different party tickets.

SPLIT TICKET (Optical scan): If the voter desires to vote a split party ticket, the voter may darken the oval next to the name of the candidates on different party tickets.

WRITE-INS (Paper ballot): If the voter desires to vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter may cross out the name of the candidate and place a cross (X) mark in the square directly to the left of the crossed-out name. If a write-in line appears on the ballot, the voter may place a cross (X) mark in the square directly to the left of the name. (Section 115.439.1(3), RSMo, 1994)

WRITE-INS (Punch card): If the voter desires to vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter may use the write-in line and punch a hole opposite the name of the candidate on the left of the name.

WRITE-INS (Optical scan): If the voter desires to vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter may cross out the name of the candidate and darken the oval next to the crossed-out name. If a write-in line appears on the ballot, the voter may darken the oval next to the name of the candidate on the write-in line.

SPOILED BALLOT: If the voter accidentally spoils the ballot or ballot card or makes an error, the voter may return it to an election official at the polling place. The ballot or ballot card must be marked "SPOILED BALLOTS". After another ballot has been prepared in the manner provided in Section 115.433, RSMo, 1994, the voter may vote another ballot.

SPOILED BALLOT: If the voter accidentally spoils the ballot or ballot is spoiled, the election judge shall mark "SPOILED" across the ballot and another ballot has been prepared in the manner provided in Section 115.439.4, RSMo, 1994)
