**CONSTITUTIONAL MEASURE NO. 2**  
(Legislative, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4014)

This measure would amend section 9 of Article I of the Constitution of North Dakota and add a new section to Article I relating to law suits against the state and employees of the state.

This measure would provide that notwithstanding any other provision of the constitution, no law suit could be brought against the state or an employee of the state acting within the employee's official capacity unless the legislative assembly provides by law the type of claims and the procedure through which those claims may be brought against the state or its employees.

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**CONSTITUTIONAL MEASURE NO. 3**  
(Legislative, House Concurrent Resolution No. 3010)

This measure would amend sections 3 and 4 of Article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota relating to the term of members of the North Dakota House of Representatives, to take effect on July 1, 1997.

This measure would lengthen the term of members of the North Dakota House of Representatives from two to four years. This measure would also provide that the legislative assembly shall establish by law a procedure whereby one-half of the members of the North Dakota House of Representatives, as nearly as is practicable, are elected biennially.

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**INITIATED CONSTITUTIONAL MEASURE NO. 4**

This measure would add a new section to Article X of the Constitution of North Dakota relating to the veterans' postwar trust fund.

This measure would make the veterans' post war trust fund, consisting of moneys transferred or credited to the fund by legislative authorization, a permanent trust fund. The fund would be invested by the state treasurer and all income generated from investments of the fund would be appropriated to the administrative committee on veterans' affairs (a 15 member committee appointed by the Governor) on a continuing basis to be utilized for programs and services which benefit veterans or the dependents of veterans.

as determined by the Secretary of State. It would also require election ballots to display the words "DECLINED TO PLEDGE TO SUPPORT TERM LIMITS." for each non-incumbent candidate declining to sign a term limits pledge, as determined by the Secretary of State.

This measure would also establish term limits for the legislative and executive branches of state government. For legislative offices with a two-year term, the limit would be three terms. For legislative offices with a four-year term, the limit would be two terms. For executive branch offices with terms of more than four years, the limit would be one term. For executive branch offices with terms of not more than four years, the limit would be two terms. Service in another office established in Article V of the Constitution of North Dakota would not disqualify a person from serving in another such office. Any office which was an elective office on January 1, 1996 (Commissioner of Labor), would remain elective except by a further amendment to the Constitution of North Dakota voted after December 31, 1996. Any contrary amendment to the Constitution of North Dakota approved in 1996 would be expressly repealed to that extent.

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**INITIATED CONSTITUTIONAL MEASURE NO. 6**

This measure would add four new sections to Article III and amend section 7 of Article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota relating to the United States Congress calling a constitutional convention.

This measure would provide for the people of North Dakota to act as the legislature of this state for the sole purpose of applying to the United States Congress to call a constitutional convention according to Article 5 of the United States Constitution. The application would request that the constitutional convention consider a constitutional amendment which would limit members of the United States House of Representatives to serve three terms and members of the United States Senate to serve two terms. Representatives serving at the time of ratification of the constitutional amendment would be limited to two additional terms and senators to one additional term.

This measure also designates the North Dakota Supreme Court as having original and exclusive jurisdiction over any challenges to this initiative. This measure further provides that the North Dakota Supreme Court would have no jurisdiction to determine whether the measure conflicts with the Constitution of North Dakota.

"This ballot contains three constitutional measures approved by the 1995 Legislative Assembly and three initiated constitutional measures. Each measure is being submitted to the voters for their approval or rejection. A voter may vote upon each separate measure by blackening the oval (  ) next to the word "yes" or "no" following each question. A voter is not required to vote upon all ballot issues."

**CONSTITUTIONAL MEASURE NO. 1**  
(Legislative, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4023)

This measure would amend subsection 2 of section 6 of Article VIII of the Constitution of North Dakota relating to the qualifications, appointment, and terms of members of the State Board of Higher Education.

This measure would reduce the term of office for members of the State Board of Higher Education from seven to four years. No member would be allowed to serve more than two terms and, except for the student member, no more than one person holding a bachelor's degree from a particular institution under the jurisdiction of the state board of higher education could serve on the board at any one time. This measure would add the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives to the existing committee (President of the North Dakota Education Association, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction) that recommends the list of nominees to the Governor in making appointments to the board. Four of the five members of the committee would have to agree on nominees being recommended to the Governor. This measure would also require the Governor to ensure that membership of the board is maintained in a balanced and representative manner.

**INITIATED CONSTITUTIONAL MEASURE NO. 5**

This measure would add new sections to Articles XI, IV, and V of the Constitution of North Dakota relating to term limits for federal, statewide executive and legislative office holders.

This measure contains a proposed amendment to the United States Constitution limiting the terms of members of the United States House of Representatives to three terms, and terms of members of the United States Senate to two terms. The measure would instruct the North Dakota congressional delegation to work for the passage of this congressional term limit amendment. It would also require election ballots to display the words "DISREGARDED VOTER INSTRUCTION ON TERM LIMITS." for each incumbent congressional candidate who did not support the congressional term limit amendment,
