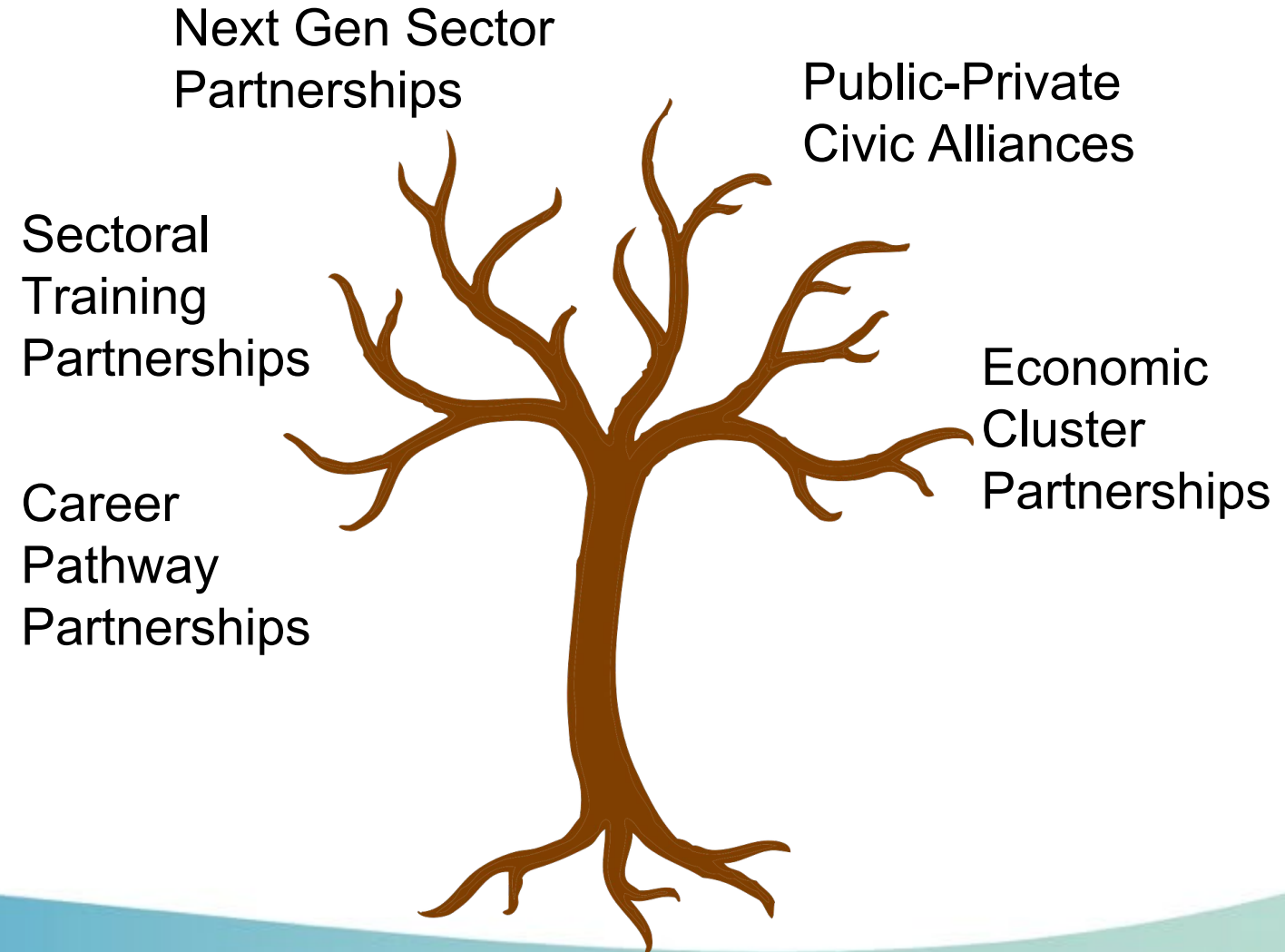
The “Extended Family” of Community-Based Partnerships

Common Elements

- Bring together employers and community partners to address shared regional workforce and economic development challenges

Distinguishing Characteristics

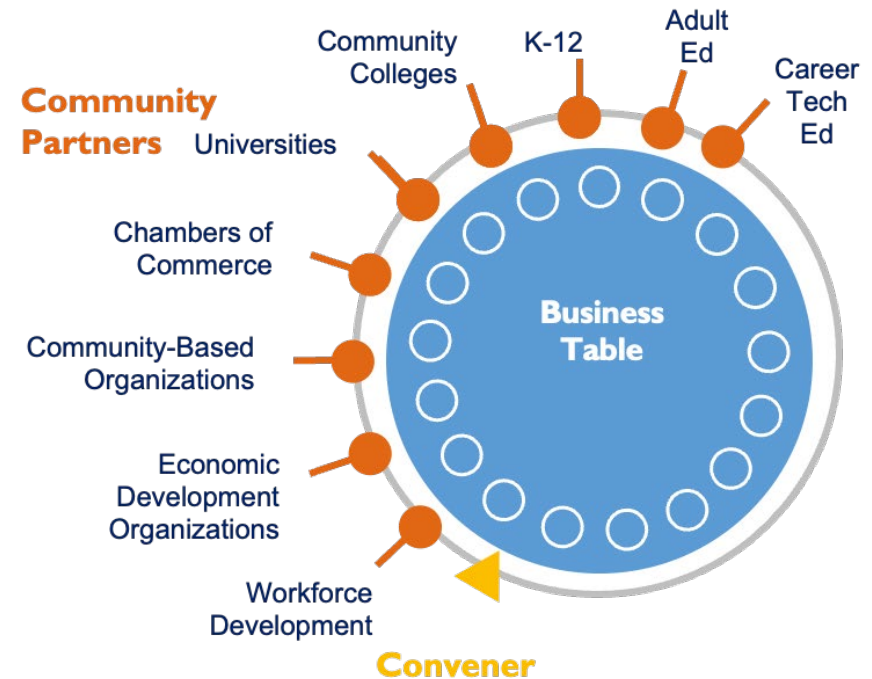
- Focus of agenda (training programs vs. broader competitiveness needs)
- Role of employers (advisors vs drivers)
- Duration and scope (time-limited initiatives vs long-term, sustainable partnership)



Definitions

- Today's conversation focuses on best practices as understood through the lens of **sector partnerships**.
- Next Gen Sector Partnership Definition: **Regional** partnerships of **business leaders** within one industry, who work together with **public partners** from economic development, workforce development, education and training, and other community organizations, to address the shared workforce and broader **competitiveness needs** of their industry.

Companies & Jobs are *not the same thing* -- How to Organize across Verticals & Horizontals

The Verticals: *How companies are organized.*

Construction/Eng

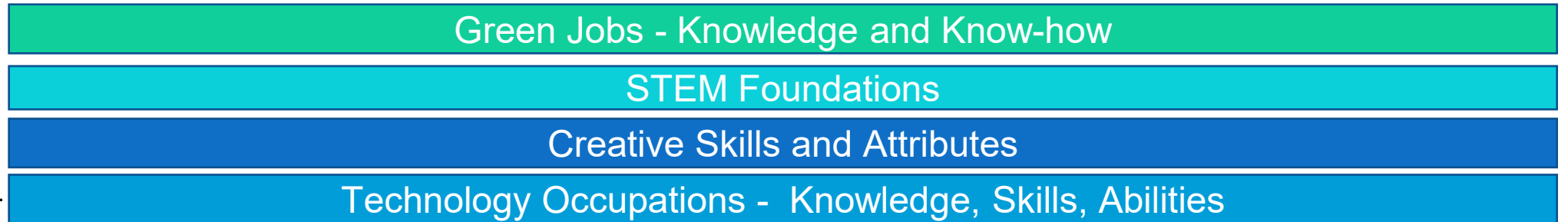
Transportation/Logistics

These should be cross-system talent initiatives that draw info from and support needs of the Verticals, but not sector partnerships.

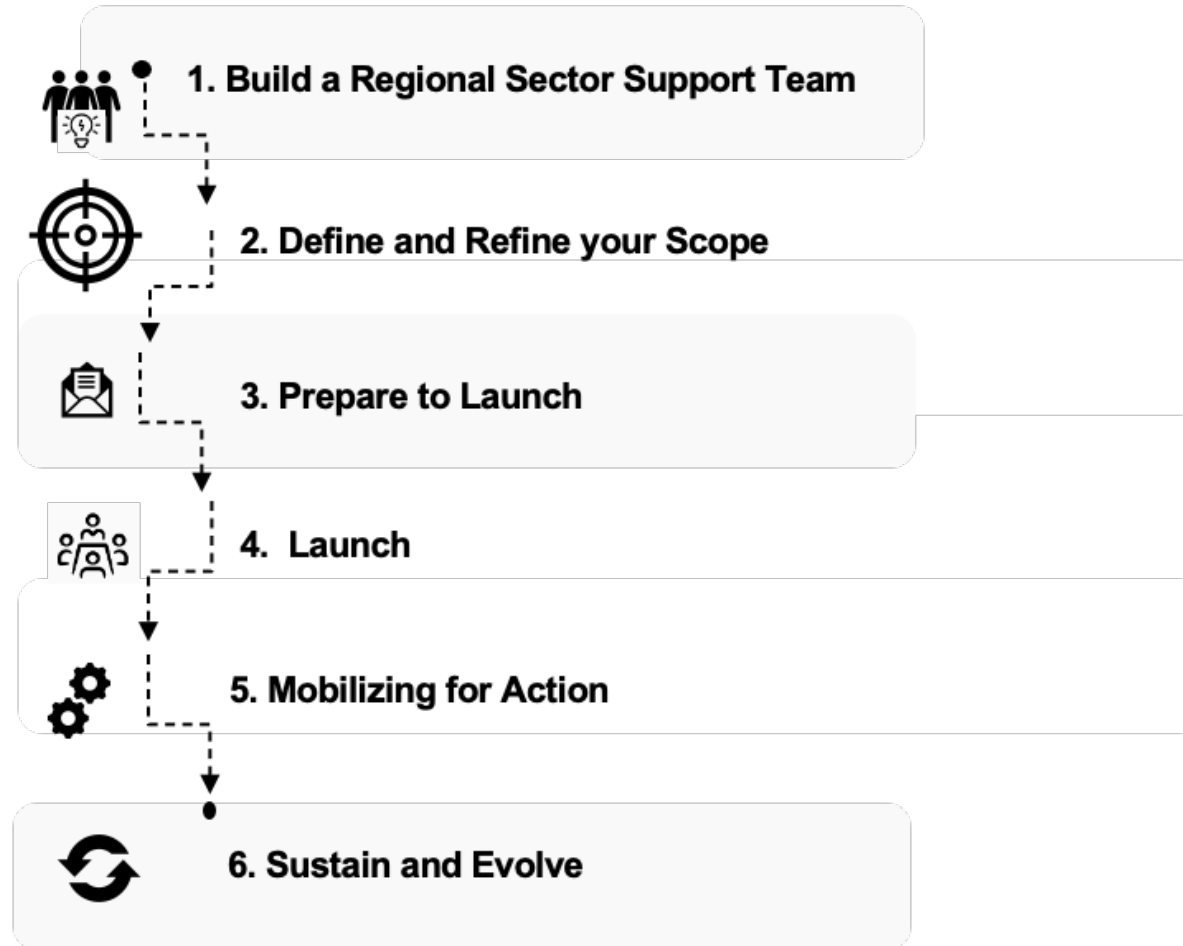

Strategies to Develop, Implement, and Sustain Partnerships



Step-by-Step Process of Building a Next Gen Sector Partnership



KEY STRATEGIES



Employer Engagement

- **Bring in champions to legitimize partnership for industry/business.**
- **Tap networks of other partners organizations to recruit the right business leaders.**
- **Value Add: What's the buy in? Why should employer/business commit time to this partnership?**



Governance Structure

- **Don't necessarily have to focus on this first.**
- **Structure should be “organic”:** focus on developing effective meetings and meaningful engagement for members first, then look at more formal governance structure to solidify membership (MOUs, ect).
- **Next Gen:** Don't look at introducing governance structure at least a year from launch (focus on building partnerships and commitments before considering governance structure).



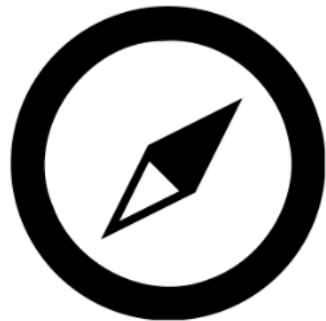

Facilitating Conversations

- Balance conversations and competing interests. Speak on where they need to improve job quality and ensure strategies are inclusive and equitable
- Spend time pushing employers in front of the room; champion group should be clear and be at the center
- Sticking to goals/objectives and clearly signaling progress made after each meeting
- Make sure data is the driver and can connect to more anecdotal points from employers and other stakeholders.




Meeting Design

First Meeting – Focus on building relationships among business leaders, give them the floor to define and champion agenda, partners in listen-only mode



Action Teams – organize work groups according to specific priorities. Employers define and achieve specific wins and deliverables, pulling in support selectively. Keep industry in driver's seat



Quarterly meetings – Use these to build buzz, momentum and hold action teams accountable for results

Sustainability

- Sustainability = long-term relevance, not just funding
- Funding Opportunities
 - Grants
 - Leveraging existing funding (ex: WIOA sector strategies)
 - Sponsorships
- Activities to Consider:
 - Job Fairs
 - Industry Events
 - Site tours
