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He has worked in forensics since 2002 and addresses elements of human expertise, statistical models of human decision-making, and the interpretation of forensic conclusions. His most recent NIJ grant uses an ordered probit model to construct likelihood ratios from black box studies. He teaches a graduate course on Bayesian statistics, an undergraduate course on Crime Scene Evidence interpretation, and various other courses such as the Psychology of Conspiracy Theories, as well as the Psychology of Attractiveness and Dating.
